AOAAM presents office-based opioid treatment program

From 7:30 am to 5 pm on Sunday, October 26, the Office-Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT) program will take place at the American Osteopathic Association's Annual Convention and Scientific Seminar. The program will take place in Venetian Room 3101 A and B in the Venetian/Palazzo Congress Center. This program is the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) waiver-granting program. Physicians who complete this program will be eligible to have an additional DEA (no cost) to prescribe sublingual buprenorphine to treat opioid dependence and withdrawal.

In 2007 the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reported that prescription overdoses were the second leading cause of accidental deaths in the United States.

Physicians who prescribe opioids for chronic pain must monitor and document the treatment carefully. Occasionally patients deviate from the prescribed protocols and often develop maladaptive behaviors consistent with opioid dependence. There are over 30 million US adults who have used opioids for non-medicinal purposes.
